Basic Education Support

Donation of a school bus, school bags and other items to the Gonzaga Jesuit Academy

The Objackson Foundation recognises that quality and accessible education for children is a key aspect in remoulding the future of every society. In line with Sustainable Development Goal 4, annually, we give out hundreds of scholarships. Also, through infrastructure, teaching aid and school supplies, ensure that teachers and their students alike get the best possible environment for equitable teaching and learning.

Within this quarter, the Foundation donated some items to the management and pupils of the Gonzaga Jesuit Academy, Okija. This initiative aims to motivate students and ease the financial burden on vulnerable families while ensuring that they get a better learning experience.

World Environment Day - June 5, 2025

The Environmental unit of the Objackson Foundation, on June 5, visited marketplaces, schools and public places for a sensitization match in commemoration of World Environmental Day to educate, enlighten and create awareness on the hazards of plastic pollution.

To mark this year's World Environment Day, the foundation hosted a sensitization session on the importance of environmental responsibility. The resource persons stressed the need for collective effort from all and sundry to ensure that the impact of the Keep Okija Clean Project in the community transcends into a clean community whose citizens are environmentally conscious.

The visit to Okija Grammar school was climaxed by the establishment of the Keep Okija Clean Ambassadors with an aim of rewarding the cleanest class, which is intended to encourage a clean and healthy environment.

Participants pledged to take conscious steps towards sustainability, echoing our belief that "Every small action counts."



Support for Digital Literacy amongst rural teachers in Anambra State-

In alignment with our commitment to promoting quality education and equipping young learners with 21st-century skills, the Objackson Foundation, during the Anambra State Universal Basic Education Board (ASUBEB) 2025 Congress, donated 50 laptops to support basic education teachers in the Anambra State in rural communities to bridge knowledge gap and bring about equitable learning for our children.

This intervention is designed to enhance ICT integration in classrooms, build digital competence among students and teachers, and close the digital divide in underserved communities. By empowering public school learners with access to technology, the Foundation is laying the groundwork for a more informed, skilled, and future-ready generation.



Menstrual Hygiene Day - May 28, 2025

In commemoration of Menstrual Hygiene Day 2025, the Objackson Foundation took proactive steps to promote menstrual health and dignity by raising awareness and distributing essential sanitary items to select schools in Okija. We distributed over 500 sanitary pads and held interactive sessions aimed at breaking the stigma surrounding menstruation.

This outreach aimed to address period poverty, combat menstrual stigma, and empower young girls with the knowledge and tools they need to manage their menstrual health safely and confidently. By fostering open conversations and providing access to menstrual products (1 Girl, 1 Pad), the Foundation reinforces its commitment to building a more equitable and #PeriodFriendlyWorld, where no girl is held back by her period.

This outreach left the girls more informed and confident about their bodies.
